My staff worked with PAG to make sure that the survey was accessible for those with visual impairments, particularly those who use screen readers. A member of my staff tested the current version with his screen reader and it works well. I would like to thank Sheila Storm at PAG for working with my office in making this survey accessible.

This is important because many of the visually impaired are part of the group of citizens that are often neglected in transportation planning: those that don't drive. Hopefully, our regional plan will include items like pedestrian improvements, better access to reliable public transit and improvements to their paratransit service. It is essential that we provide everyone in the region with access to safe and reliable public transit and this is your opportunity to make a difference.
