NEW PARKS AND RECREATION FEES TO TAKE EFFECT JULY 1

On Tuesday, April 9, 2024, Tucson's Mayor and Council adopted Tucson Parks and Recreation revised rates and fees. The proposed rate changes will go into effect on Monday, July 1. Fees changes include free recreation center facility access for smaller recreation centers and new fees for commercial use of parks, youth sports field lighting, swim team pool rentals, ramadas, and tennis/pickleball court use for courts under contract management.

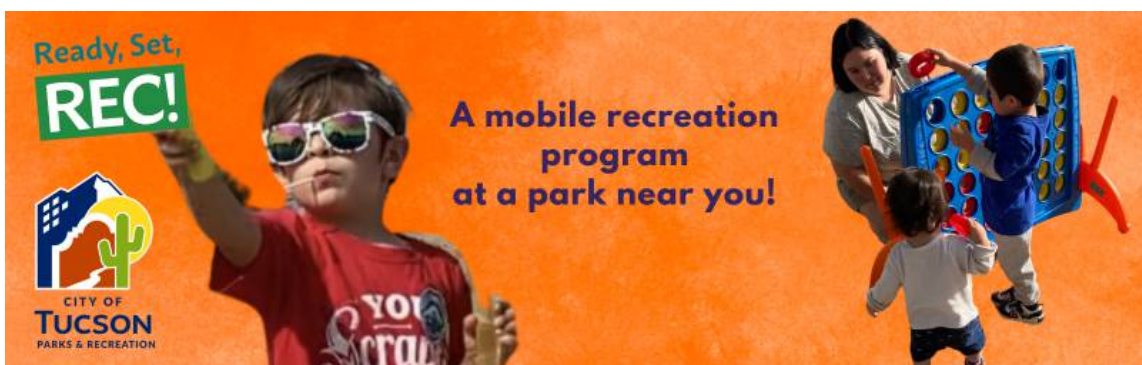




REGISTER FOR SUMMER SWIM LESSONS

In November 2018, City of Tucson voters approved Proposition 407, a \$225 million bond package for capital improvements. CITY OF TUCSON UNVEILS NEW PLAYGROUND AT PARKVIEW PARK AND COMPLETES JULIA KEEN NEIGHBORHOOD STREET IMPROVEMENTS

City of Tucson Ward 5 Council Member Richard Fimbres, the Department of Transportation and Mobility, and Tucson Parks and Recreation invite you to celebrate the completion of a new playground at Parkview Park and roadway improvements throughout the Julia Keen neighborhood. The ribbon-cutting event will take place at Parkview Park, 1521 S. Chrysler Ave., on Saturday, June 8, at 9 a.m. The playground was made possible through Tucson Delivers, 2018 voter-approved Proposition 407 bond funds and Impact Fees. The roadway improvement project began in January 2024 as part of the 2022 voter-approved Proposition 411 Tucson Delivers Better Streets program.
